

Sunday, February 17, 2008 Snow Festival on Saint-Bernard Island

(Châteauguay, January 17, 2008) – On February 17, Héritage Saint-Bernard offers a day of winter activities on Saint-Bernard Island in Châteauguay. Workshops are offered free of charge to all out-door enthusiasts, big and small ! The event is made possible through the generous contribution of our Member of the National Assembly Jean-Marc Fournier.

Schedule of events

11 a.m. — Hiking in the refuge faunique Marguerite-D'Youville

Accompanied by a naturalist guide, participants will take to the snow covered trails of this winter wonderland, discover the richness of this protected environment, feed the birds and maybe even meet a deer! Duration: 45 minutes

11 a.m. — Ice sculpture workshop

Families are invited to create their own masterpiece with a block of ice and some easy-to-use tools. The ice sculpture workshop will be supervised by an employee of Héritage Saint-Bernard. Duration: until 4 p.m. or all of the ice blocks are used

11 a.m. to 4 p.m. — Games and animation

Games and animation based on the theme of nature will take place for families in the Island Pavillon.

1 p.m. — Historic hike

A guide will take participants on a walk and will discuss the history of the island and the region and will discover the marvellous ancestral buildings, some of which date back to the XVIIth and XVIIIth century. Participants will also learn about Marguerite d'Youville, founder of the Grey Nuns and the last owner of the Seigniory of Châteauguay. Duration: 45 minutes

Individuals interested in taking part in the guided workshops (refuge faunique Marguerite-D'Youville and historic hikes) must present themselves at least 10 minutes in advance at the *Café de l'île*. Departures will take place from that location.

On site, visitors can also use the trails of the wildlife refuge on their own; families can snack, warm-up and rent raquettes and Nordic walking poles!
